

Dear Parents/Guardians,

At Billesley Primary School, we are lucky enough to have access to a whole school reading programme called Bug Club. If you have access to an internet connection then your child can enjoy reading Bug Club books online. Each child has their own homepage, and books have been allocated to your child's account that are tailored to your child's level. Bug Club is 100% safe for children to use. It is simply a virtual library with some games as a reward for reading.

Please read the information below about how your children can log in at home and enjoy this incredible online reading world.

Your child's password and username will be in their reading diaries. The school code is: yaec.

Once you are logged in your child's homepage will appear and their books will appear in 'My Stuff' area. To open a book, just click on the book of your choice. There are quiz questions for your children to answer throughout the book by clicking on the bug icon. This checks your child's understanding and we can monitor how your child is progressing.


Children can also earn Active Learn coins to spend on different games within Bug Club. The more books they read, the more coins they earn! When your child has finished a book, it will be moved into 'My Library' where they can read it again if they wish, or can choose a new book from their 'My Stuff' area.

Certificates and prizes will be handed out in assembly to the children who have read the most books on Bug Club over the month. We are encouraging our children to read as much as possible as the benefits are HUGE.

To access Bug Club, children can use a computer, Ipad or smartphone connected to the internet. If you have any issues or questions, please speak to your class teacher who will be happy to help.

Also, you can encourage your child to record their Bug Club reading in their reading diary, as this counts towards your child's weekly reading comments! And comments win prizes!

We hope that your child can fully engage with this wonderful resource.
